PARKER'S HOUSE CELEBRATES A ONE-YEAR ANNIVERSARY

Union Mission and dignitary's celebrated the One-Year Anniversary of Parker's House with a press conference to highlight program success and client impact, followed by a reception and optional tour.

"The demand for Parker's House from women in our community has been tremendous," said Greg Parker, Parker's Founder & CEO. "We're incredibly impressed by the way this facility has been laser-focused on offering much-needed housing and essential supportive services in its first year of operation."

Our program provides the secure foundation needed to obtain safe, stable housing

The women served at Parker's House are the face of resilience and hope. Since opening on September 6, 2022, Parker's House has achieved the following:

- 222 women served, more than double initial projections
- 60% employed at entry
- 136 obtained safe and stable housing
- 148 increased income through employment and benefits
- 50% engaged in Mental Health Counseling Services
- 19,980 meals provided

"Our program provides the secure foundation needed to obtain safe, stable housing," said Michael Traynor, President & CEO of Union Mission. "We are proud to offer a suite of housing and supportive services that empower individuals to achieve their goals with courage and confidence."

Union Mission's Parker's House partners with women to foster personal, economic, and housing stability by providing 90 days of emergency housing and supportive services for up to 32 women at a time.

As 2023 comes to a close, it is a time of reflection, giving thanks, and providing comfort to the most vulnerable in our community.

In its 86 years serving Savannah, Union Mission has always been a safe haven, providing food, clothing, housing, and other basic needs to the homeless in our community.

This year has continued that service, but the need is greater than ever.

Through September, Union Mission has served 1,065 individuals across our many housing programs from Statesboro to Savannah to Jesup, not including our Day Center. We projected to serve 1,018 for the entire year.

The Day Center has served 722 unduplicated individuals in its first nine months with 14,853 visits and 27,678 meals served.

And our mental health counseling group has conducted 1,682 sessions and 168 groups as well.

Your support has allowed us to be there for those in need. Without it, we would not have been able to expand our services to their current
