EXCEEDING PROJECTIONS

Happy New Year! We hope you had a joyous holiday season, and you are starting the year off on a great note.

2023 was one of busiest years on record. We served 1,250 people in our programs excluding the new Day Center at Grace House. This is 21% higher than we projected to serve and covers 266 children and 984 adults.

The new Day Center served 896 people, with total visits of 19,451 and nearly 39,000 meals served. This is an incredible new service for our community's homeless population.

Wrapping it all together was the 283 clients served by our very important Mental Health Counseling Center team. The number of counseling sessions during the year totaled 2,052 with 214 group sessions being held as well. Our Mental Health Counseling

Center is a vital part of our solutions set and making a strong difference for our clients.

Our vision is to partner with people to end their homelessness and Union Mission is making a difference in getting individuals and families to stable housing.

In 2024, we will continue to work on our strategic initiatives around our people, our clients, our facilities, our partners, and being fiscally strong.

We know that we cannot do our work alone and it takes working together to overcome the many challenges faced by the homeless in our community.

UNION MISSION **CELEBRATES** THE ONE-YEAR **ANNIVERSARY OF** THE DAY CENTER AT **GRACE HOUSE**

In the first year of operation, the Day Center at Grace House served 896 unduplicated individuals with 19,451 total visits and nearly 39,000 additional meals. Initially intending to assist up to 50 individuals daily, Union Mission exceeded this target with numerous days over 110 and a recent consistent average of 85 individuals per day.

"Union Mission has been proud to partner with the City of Savannah and the Chatham Savannah Authority for the Homeless over the past year," said Michael Traynor, Union Mission President & CEO. "We have filled a strategic gap in services for the homeless while making an effective and compassionate program to the most vulnerable in our community."

Since opening in December 2022, the Day Center has provided unsheltered homeless individuals with basic needs such as food, clothing, referrals, access to supportive services, shelter from weather conditions, and other critical wrap-around services. This program is open weekdays from 8:30am - 4:00pm and beginning January 6, 2024, open every Saturday from 8:30am - 2:00pm with additional extended hours in the case of extreme weather.

Invitational

Thanks to a 5-year partnership with K Machine, Union Mission will be the beneficiary of the Applied Underwriters Invitational Golf Tournament at Richmond Hill Golf Club, adding a second signature event for Union Mission. The successful event had 25 golf teams participate and one team, Port City Logistics, qualified for the National Tournament in Branson, MO on May 1 – 5, 2024.
