MAKING A DIFFERENCE WITH YOUR SUPPORT

It has been very busy at Union Mission as we partner with people to end their homelessness. With three new programs opening in the last year, we have focused on integrating the new initiatives into our daily operations. The demand for our services is stronger than ever.

We thought we would serve 100 unaccompanied, homeless women at Parker's House in the first year. In ten months, we have served 185 women.

We opened the Day Center in December last year and we expected to serve 50 people daily. We are averaging more than 70 people daily and have served more than 360 unduplicated individuals with wraparound services and a place away from the weather. The center allows us to connect people to partners and address the root causes of the homeless.

On any given night, Union Mission houses more than 300 people across our many programs from Savannah to Statesboro to Jesup. Our goal is to get people to stable housing and we are making a difference with your support and the support of others.

Union Mission has also been recognized with the generosity of The Hearst Foundations and recently has been awarded a grant to partner with landlords to open a minimum of 20 new housing units in the Bulloch County area. The Bulloch program will start in September this year.

As we continue to fill gaps in service in our community, your support is vital to our success. We thank you for assisting on our journey as we provide hope, compassion, and impact focused on the clients we serve.

UNION MISSION'S CLOTHING CLOSET

Thank you for supporting this Union Mission client in his effort to acquire clothing and get dressed for success. Your donations go directly to support Union Mission clients and our most vulnerable neighbors.

Your donations make an impact! In the first seven months of this year, Union Mission served 546 individuals through our Clothing Closet distributing 567 pants, 1,292 shirts, 382 pairs of shoes, 156 dresses, 467 pairs of socks, and 131 undergarments free to Union Mission clients and the community at large.
